## Mental Health Resources

- NIOSH has launched a guide offering <u>Action Steps to Help Improve Healthcare Workers Well-Being</u>. The guide offers six concrete Action Steps that hospital leaders can take to accelerate or supplement well-being efforts for hospital staff. It was developed in partnership with the Dr. Lorna Breen Heroes Foundation and tested in six CommonSpirit hospitals across the U.S.
- NIOSH collaborated with the American Journal of Public Health (AJPH) to publish <u>Strategies to Improve Mental Health and Well-Being Among Healthcare Workers</u>. The guidelines were developed to address current challenging working conditions that may cause or intensify poor mental health outcomes among healthcare workers.
- Health Action Alliance (HAA) is holding its 3rd Annual Workplace Mental Health Action Summit on Thursday, May 4 at 2 PM ET. This is a free virtual Summit that encourages business leaders to discover effective strategies for prioritizing mental health, leading to a more engaged and productive workforce.

#### Prevent Falls in Construction

The 11th Annual National Safety Stand-Down to Prevent Falls in Construction will take place from May 6-10, 2024. Companies can conduct a Safety Stand-Down by taking a break for a toolbox talk or other safety activity such as conducting safety equipment inspections, developing rescue plans,
