Stay Safe in the Heat

OSHA has developed two new education resources to help employers and workers stay safe in the heat. The first is a fact sheet highlighting [young workers](#) and the important precautions this group should take before starting their work in the heat. According to data from the CDC, young workers experience higher rates of job-related injury than older workers.

The second resource is a [customizable conversation guide](#) for employers, managers, or supervisors to review with their workers. This is a 5-step, 5-minute conversation to plan

and remind each other about necessary actions to take in the event of a heat emergency. The guide provides an opportunity to initiate meaningful conversations about planning, reminding and summarizing to reinforce knowledge.
