Updated inspections for high injury/illness rates

The Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) has updated the inspection program for establishments with the highest rates of injuries and illnesses. Establishments that used OSHA Form 300A from calendar years 2021-2023 may be selected for inspection based on high injury and illness rates, upwardly trending injury and illness rates, injury and illness rates markedly below industry averages or a failure to submit an OSHA Form 300A in 2023.
