Extreme Heat - Proposed Ruling

Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) released a [proposed rule](#) that would protect approximately 36 million workers from extreme heat. Under the rule, employers would be required to develop an injury and illness prevention plan to address excessive heat. This would include

evaluating heat risks and in certain cases implementing rest breaks, requirements for drinking water and controlling indoor heat.

An official version of the proposed rule will soon be published in the Federal Register. The public is encouraged to submit written comments once the rule is published. The agency anticipates a public hearing after the written comment period has closed. [Click here](#) for more information.
